4. BEHAVIOURAL DISCIPLINE OR CODES OF CONDUCT IN CLASSROOM AND COLLEGE PREMISES - DO'S AND DONT'S

9. Admission policy-2023-2025

- i. Admission to the B.Ed. Course is made according to the norms of the Higher Education Department, Govt. of West Bengal and NCTE.
- ii. The entire Admission process will be carried out in stand-alone basis and merit-based online mode.
- iii. Any wrong information provided in the Application Form

or during any time of the Admission process will lead to cancellation of Admission.

iv. Online Form fill up date: From 1st September, 2023 to 10th September, 2023 (11.59 P. M.)

v. Online Application Fee Submission: No Application Fee is required for Admission for the Session 2023-25.

vi. Total Intake Capacity: 50 (03 for deputed candidates, and 47 for Fresher candidates)

Deputed candidates in different subjects will be selected on the basis of experience.

Fresher candidates in different subjects will be selected strictly on merit basis.

vii. Eligibility criteria:

Marks required - Applicants, both deputed and fresher, must have at least 50% marks in Bachelors' Degree and/or in the Masters' degree Examination in any recognized

University. There shall be a relaxation of 5% Marks for SC / ST candidates.

Age limit - 37 years for fresher candidates as on 01.07.2023. There shall be a relaxation of age 5 years for SC/ST candidates.

viii. Subject to opt - Candidates must opt one school subject that they have studied either at Graduation or at Post Graduation level, from the following subjects

A. Language Group: i) Bengali. ii) English.

B. Social Science Group: i) History. ii) Geography. iii) Education.

Candidates having Hons /M.A. in Sanskrit, Political Science, Philosophy or any other relevant Subject with at least one of the above mentioned 'Language' /or 'Social Science' subjects (the above 5 Subjects) at the Graduation level may also apply. However, such candidates would be treated as General Graduate Students and their Academic Scores are to be calculated accordingly.
